# READINESS TO END FGM ASSESSMENT

- Involves 5 Steps:
- 1. Identify people who represent the views of the community.
- 2.Decide how the assessment will be undertaken
- 3. Undertake the assessment using the question naire schedule
- 4. A ssessment is scored by independent scorers using the anchor ratings
- 5 . Stage of readiness to end FGM agreed.

- Behaviour Change Activities:
- Community Evaluation: Pre and post intervention REPLACE Community Readiness to End FGM Assessment
- Individual Evaluation: Questionnaires and scaled measures of individual's beliefs that are targeted by intervention content
- Engagement statistics: Records of instances of the target intervention
   action, numbers of people reached, numbers of new community
   members who want to get involved in future work based on engagement
   with each target intervention action
